Dear Mr. Wood:

Thank you for meeting with us and showing us the EndoTherm refrigerator thermometer. We appreciate that you presented it to the Southern Nevada Health District prior to industry.

Our regulations, the Southern Nevada Health District (SNHD), Regulations Governing the Sanitation of Food Establishments 96, section 96.03.0300 states "2. Temperature sensing and indicating devices shall be provided for each temperature zone of the refrigerator and/or freezer. These devices shall have an accuracy of $\pm 2^{\circ}$ F. ($\pm 1^{\circ}$ C.) at the critical range, be easy to read, securely mounted, and readily visible. The sensing element shall be easily cleanable and located to reflect the air temperature of the warmest part of the cabinet where food is normally stored. Thermometers shall be graduated in no greater than 2° F. (1° C.) increments throughout the use range." The EndoTherm refrigerator thermometer meets these requirements.

The Health District's acceptance of your product for use in Clark County is not to be construed as an endorsement of the product or any claims made on its behalf. Furthermore, the statements made in this letter may not be used for any commercial purpose.
